The Year 11 Legal Studies classes visited the Downing Centre on Tuesday to observe courts in action. The students



went with the Rule of Law organisation who arranged for the students to meet with Judge Atkinson for a rundown of procedures and some of her history. The students were then able to access a high profile case and see the procedures for a multi-defendant trial. One of the Barristers then kindly explained some of the issues in the morning tea break. Students were then free to access many of the local courts and view proceedings. One case was particularly interesting, a GBH case from a nightclub incident. It gave the students a good idea of evidence and witness questioning, with some very amusing lawyers. As always, the legal personnel at the centre were very accommodating for our students.
