Remembrance Day Assembly

Building Update

Temporary fencing was erected on the top oval this week in preparation for the arrival of 12 demountable classrooms to replace the classrooms in C-Block. C-Block will be refurbished during 2019 and at the completion of the project we will have new facilities in woodwork, metalwork, art and music. It is expected that the demountable classrooms will be delivered in the next two weeks and then made ready for their use in 2019. A significant amount of the top oval has been fenced off indicating just how much space the 12 demountable classrooms will take up.

Applications are open for students to participate in the 2019 Arts Alive Combined Schools Choir (AACSC) Program. Students in Years 4 - 6 (Primary Choir) and 7-12 (Secondary Choir) attending government schools in the Metropolitan North Directorate are encouraged to apply. In 2019, the AACSC is open to Years 4 to 6 in the primary choir and Years 7 to 12 in the secondary program. The choir encourages, nurtures and inspires talented vocalists by providing high quality training and performance opportunities. The primary choir consists of soprano and alto voices, and the secondary choir consists of soprano, alto, tenor and bass voices.

Performance Opportunities

In 2019, the choir will perform at the Sydney Town Hall and the Sydney Opera House as part of the Arts Alive Primary Choral Concert Series. They will perform at Department of Education functions (previous performances have included Government House) and as part of the Voices in Performance (VIP) program for The Arts Unit. There will be opportunities to perform at major events. Students have the opportunity to attend the State Music Camp, coordinated by The Arts Unit and the Schools Spectacular. The choir participates in workshops with Australian composers and conductors of the highest calibre, such as Katie Noonan and Sally Whitwell.

Repertoire will include specially commissioned works, jazz, music of other cultures, indigenous music, musical theatre, gospel and traditional choral music.

Rehearsals

The choirs rehearse weekly after school at two locations: Pennant Hills PS on Mondays and Belrose PS on Wednesdays. The Primary Choir rehearsal is from 4:00pm – 5:00pm and the Secondary Choir rehearsal is from 5:00pm – 6:30pm at both venues.

Applications are now open. Students need to choose which choir (Pennant Hills or Belrose) they would like to join. Auditions will be held at the venues below.
