## Presentation Day - a celebration of learning

# CAREERS UPDATE

#### Year 10 Work Experience in Week 8

It was great to know all of year 10 were able to secure work experience this week. They are working at some interesting industries and places such as law firm, parliament house, museum, zoo, universities, dentist, physiotherapy, finance, IT, real estate, vet clinic, primary schools, retail, hospitality, trades

and others. The week is made available each year for students to either test a possible future career, be observed by an employer with a view to gaining a part-time job before the Christmas busy period or to gain some transferable employability skills. Students are completing a journal and employer evaluation report during the week, which can be used as a reference for their resume. Mr Ryan has sent in photos of two students Paul and Luke he visited on work experience. I have already emailed to year 9 students the work experience forms for next year to give them a



year's notice as some high demand placements require students to contact employers this year. If a student needs assistance in finding a suitable employer please encourage them to see me as I have plenty of contacts for them to access.

#### Year 9 Work Experience in 2019 Term 4, Week 8, 2-6 December 2019

I have emailed to students and uploaded to Google classroom the work experience forms for 2019 with instructions for completing them. Some places which have a high demand for work experience require students to apply 1 year before work experience so some students need to make contact with employers this year.
