Our budding artists exhibit at Operation Art 2018

It is very exciting to have four of our students' artwork chosen to be exhibited at The Armory Gallery, Sydney Olympic Park on Saturday 15 September. Student works will be selected to become part of the permanent art collection of The Children's Hospital at Westmead. This exhibition should expect more than 10 000 visitors to view this exhibition.

Year 10 students attend bstreetsmart at Qudos Arena on Wednesday

bstreetsmart is the inspiring initiative of the Trauma Service at Westmead Hospital that has been running for 13 years. About 23 000 students attend each year with the purpose to reduce the fatality and injury rates of young people by promoting safe behaviour as drivers, riders and passengers. It was a very confronting and sobering day with a number of victims of road trauma sharing their experiences. Narrated by two trauma anaesthetists, the program began with a realistic, hard-hitting crash scene of teenage drivers distracted by their mobiles after leaving from a party. This was followed by the stories of two young men whose accidents left them with life changing brain injuries. Wheelchair bound Heidi Heydon became a T4 complete paraplegic when she was T-boned in a roundabout on her motorbike. She shared her inspiring story of a lifelong journey to a new life. Andrew and Damo from Theatre Sports ran through different scenarios and scenes to give strategies to know what to say whenever you're feeling unsafe as a passenger. All speaker's emphasised that passengers have a responsibility to the driver, to generate the conversations that will save your life. Finally, loss of her 17-year-old son from a mother's perspective, Katie Woodfield, killed by a speeding drink driver, was very heartbreaking and raw leaving the audience silent and reflective. Trent Driving School also demonstrated stopping distances at various speeds and aptly illustrated the serious consequences to just go over 10kms. The impact of the day made me more mindful of my driving and hopefully will resonate with our students who soon will become learner drivers.











Debating Success!

On Thursday Year 7/8 St Ives B Debating Team competed against Chatswood High School in the third round of the Premier's Debating Challenge. The topic of today's debate was 'That mandatory parenting courses be introduced'. St Ives argued in the negative and were successful in winning the debate! This means that we now have a play off debate between our two teams to find the winner of Zone 1 and the team to progress through to the Quarter Finals. This is a massive achievement the teams who have come up against strong groups from Chatswood High School and Asquith Girls High School. New South Wales Schools State Constitutional Convention

Rojina P of Year 11 has been selected to participate in the New South Wales Schools Constitutional Convention at Parliament House, Macquarie Street, Sydney, on Tuesday 30 October. One hundred students are selected annually to participate in this program. This one-day convention is part of a national program for Year 11 students to consider issues relating to the Australian Constitution. A keynote address is followed by facilitated small group discussions. Participants then vote in a referendum on the issues discussed. Student peer-select 30 delegates to attend a national convention held early in the following year, in Canberra with delegates from all other states and territories.

2018 NSW SCHOOLBOYS TABLE TENNIS SHIELD Student report by Behbod I, Year 12

On 27th August, our table tennis team entered the 2018 NSW Schoolboys Shield tournament with pleasing results. The tournament consisted of around 40 schools and 150 people, with pairs of players in teams, each player having to complete two singles and one doubles match. St. Ives entered three teams: Dushmantha G and Behbod I, Nikolai W and Barton Y, Dennis C and Sohrab S. While they faced tough opposition, all teams were able to comfortably clear the first round, successfully reaching the knockout round. Unfortunately, the second round presented the boys with overwhelming opposition, including multiple players in state and national levels, leading to their defeat in the knockout round. Specifically, Dennis and Sohrab were presented with the Killara 1 team, which had national players, and later successfully won the entire tournament. Dur-

ing this encounter, to everyone's surprise, Dennis exceeded expectations through his performance, his unique style of play confusing even the most experienced opponents. Nonetheless, even with Dennis outperforming himself, they were overpowered by Killara 1's adaptability. Although, the team was much more successful in the singles knockout rounds, Behbod reaching the semi-finals, while Dushmantha successfully won the singles competition, surpassing opponents of varying playstyles. The team cheering him on right till the end. This was the first time St Ives had won a singles table tennis competition of this scale. The boys were commended for their exceptional sportsmanship, and overall gained invaluable experience playing many other players from different schools. Respect, perseverance and growth were certainly reflected in the team's behaviour both on the court and off it.






