The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)



Year 7 and 9 students sat a number of NAPLAN tests this Tuesday to Friday. On Tuesday, Language Conventions and Writing were held; Wednesday, Reading and on Thursday, Numeracy. NAPLAN will run for a two week period in NSW due to the fine tuning of online testing. However, at SIHS we fortunately sat the traditional pen and paper test, this meant there were no glitches to worry about! NAPLAN 2019 results will be provided to schools from mid-August to mid-September.

Shakespeare's Henry IV Part 1 comes to life for Year 12 English Advanced students

Year 12 English Advanced students attended *Sport For Jove's HSC Symposium* on *Henry VI Part 1* last Tuesday at the Seymour Centre. Significant scenes were explored, interspersed with expert commentary from the director examining ideas and perspectives from one of Shakespeare's most famous play. This symposium offered opportunities to deepen student's practical understanding through experiencing and analysing key scenes and characters in performance. This was an invaluable experience as we begin our final module in HSC English Advanced.



Year 12 learning about People and Economic activity

On Monday 13 May, Mr Cullen and 10 members of his Year 12 Geography class visited the luxurious surrounds of the Hilton Hotel as it is a case study for the HSC Geography course. It was an opportunity to explore the operations of the hotel for their HSC topic: People and Economic activity. They were guided around by the hotel's HR manager who showed them the variety of rooms offered to clients and discussed issues around tourism. Students were informed on how the hotel meets environmental, staffing and other regulatory issues. Following on from that, students went to the Reserve Bank where they received a lecture on the complexities of the Australian economic system and also about the economy generally.

On Monday our Year 11 and 12 Spanish students had a wonderful opportunity to join with other local high school senior Spanish courses (from Narrabeen and Ku-ring-gai) to watch one of the fabulous recently acclaimed Spanish films from the Spanish Film Festival. The day was also a great opportunity for students to meet some other kids also doing their course and socialise over a delicious Spanish lunch.

Senior Sport Coaches train in Basketball

This week Year 11 and 12 VET Sport Coaches commenced an intensive basketball program to further develop their coaching skills. This is a 7-week program with each week focusing on mastering one skill. This week the students targeted dribbling and how to teach this in a variety of ways so as to keep their audience engaged. Thanks to the NSBL coaches for running the sessions.

Timber Classes at SIHS

Year 11 student Luke Ryder has worked productively using various timber machinery such as the lathe, band saw and router to complete his wine table. Year 9 Timber elective students have been designing and fabricating their jewellery box making mitre joints and laminating different timbers to create patterns.





Technology Mandatory

Students from both Year 7 and Year 8 are working an Engineering unit of work. One of the initial tasks is to build the tallest tower possible from three pieces of A4 paper and 600 mm of masking tape. LOST HEARING AID

The **Bone Anchored Hearing Aid** (**BAHA**) is a surgically implanted **device** designed to help people with **hearing** loss. The majority of the conventional **hearing** aids transmit sound through the medium of air conduction. The small brown box is part of the hearing aide and is magnetic to a disc that has been implanted on the skin of the skull.

One of our students who has a significant hearing loss has lost her BAHA possibly when changing for sport. If you have found the BAHA please return to the LOTE staffroom as soon as possible
